Role of EAWG	How?
Promote and co-ordinate working partnerships	Via joint working papers and face-to-face workshops, spin-off projects where mutual interests identified .Information updates on meeting agenda; shared file space/website; use of mailing lists
Facilitate exchange of knowledge and data	Via joint working papers and face-to-face workshops
Foster collaboration	Developing joint outputs but also spin-off projects where mutual interests identified
Awareness raising of EST, ES and EA	EST via information updates; awareness of other concepts; Via joint working papers and face-to-face workshops
Explore and develop new concepts	Working papers posing new questions or ways of tackling ES or an EA
