12.00 Gaps and Gulfs in 'getting' Agriculture 2018 - LEAF Speak Out Training, Susie Emmett Farm Tour of LEAF Demonstration Farm, Great Wollaston, Robert Kynaston Great Wollaston, Halfway House, Shrewsbury, Shropshire, SY5 9DN

Speak Out training/masterclass will focus on the gaps closing and gulfs opening in 2017-18. We will look at what you are saying, showing and sharing about where we currently are in farming, and where we want to go, and will equip you to move these discussions forward. We will get a review of how issues were handled well (by LEAF Network members) - and less well - in 2017 and pick up lessons and techniques to take into 2018 with words, images, film and social media. We will sharpen skills of chairing and steering discussions and meetings as methods to change minds and influence people.

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During the afternoon, Robert will take us on a tour of LEAF Demonstration Farm, Great Wollaston. IFM is at the heart of activities for the 80-strong dairy herd and this promises to be a fascinating insight into the workings of this successful family farm and its communication strategy to inspire and influence visitors. We will also use the tour to try some of the new Speak Out techniques learnt.

The whole afternoon will also put us in the right frame of mind to critically analyse the evening talks and visits the following day. How can radical changes such as robotics and automation or welfare design be segued into mainstream and what are your roles in promoting these changes and explaining them?

Simon will also discuss how they use this work to continually develop technology on-farm and some of the mechanisms for this such as the Agri-EPI satellite farms.
