World Soil Information

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ISRIC's Mission

- Inform and educate (World Soil Museum)
- Assemble, maintain and disseminate soil data
- Develop and apply methods to derive soil maps (point observations, area class maps and other information)
- Support users of soil information (applied research on land resources and the environment)



ISRIC Monolith Collection

Reference collection of 1,100 undisturbed soil profiles from 75 countries with accompanying information



WSM Visitors and Groups

- The World Soil Museum (WSM) is well known both nationally and internationally; ~ 1,000 references on the Internet
- Ca. 30 to 50 groups per year + spontaneous visitors
- Visitor numbers around 800 (ranging between about 400 to 1000)
- Universities in the Netherlands, Germany, Belgium, UK and sometimes USA, Russia, Thailand, Japan, China, Iraq, etc.
