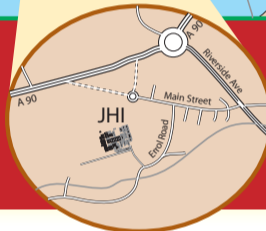
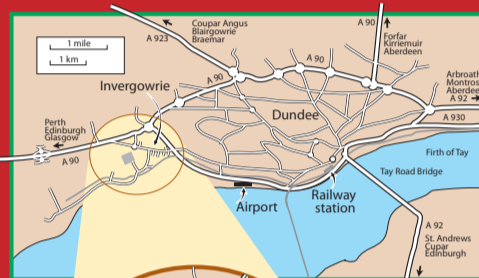

The keynote seminar for 2011 is a presentation on The Scientific Curation of the National Fruit Collection from Matthew Ordidge, University of Reading. Further presentations will be given

The field tour will enable participants to observe and sample new raspberry selections in breeding plots and to view field experiments at The James Hutton Institute.
