Information for Exhibitors

Time of Event 8.30am to 4.30pm on Thursday 11 August 2016

Please take the time to read through this document carefully and well in advance of the event. There is some very important information included which will have an impact on your set up arrangements and we want to make sure both set up and event days run as smoothly as possible for everyone concerned. Remember we're here to help but we need everyone to follow the plan.

General Information

All exhibitors will receive a pack on the day which includes a copy of the Event Guide and two sets of food and drink vouchers per stand/plot. If you wish to purchase additional vouchers for stand staff at £5 per set, please contact the James Hutton Institute event team prior to the event on events@hutton.ac.uk. Also included in your pack will be two generic exhibitor badges. Please wear these during the day so you are easily identifiable as an exhibitor. Staff will be wearing similar badges.

Stand setup and dismantle arrangements

The site will be available for setting up from **10am – 6pm on Wednesday 10 August** and all stands and exhibits must be onsite and completed **before 8am on Thursday 11 August.** You'll be able to access the site on event day from **7.15am.**

The site is closed after 8pm on Wednesday and the gates to the site will be closed and locked after this time. For insurance purposes, vehicles are not permitted to be left at the site overnight.

N.B. For safety reasons, stands and exhibits must not be dismantled until after the close of the event at 4.30pm.









Vehicle access during set up and take down period

If the site is affected by adverse weather conditions, it may not be possible to unload exhibits or machinery close to the marquee or field plots. As well as health and safety reasons, this ensures that the site is in as good a condition as possible for the event.

Please follow the signs to the parking area, at the south end of the site, and respect the instructions given to you by the parking attendants.

If an area is blocked off by barriers, this means the access point is closed off and you need to go around the barriers. Please do not move these barriers for any reason.

Machinery exhibits

To avoid issues with heavy traffic through the village as well as site access issues during a very busy period on event day, your machinery must be on site by **6pm Wednesday 10 August**. Access to the site will be available between 10am and 6pm. Please contact John Bennett on 07739 296 426 when you arrive at the farm.

Marquee Exhibitors

Included at the end of this document is a map of the marquee layout. Each stand is numbered and will be marked out on set up day. In addition, events staff will be on hand all day to show you where to set up.

All electrical equipment other than lights, laptops and monitors must carry a valid PAT test label or it will not be allowed to be connected to the power supply.

Field Demonstration Plots

If you are bringing a field marquee, this must be erected before event day and must not exceed 3m x 3m in size. If you didn't pre-book a field marquee, your plot will not be set up to accommodate one so don't bring one. Please liaise with farm staff on set up day and they will show you where you can erect your marquee.

Plot Tours

Organised tours of the plots will start at 9.30am, 11.55am and 3pm. These are a taster for visitors who can then revisit plots they are interested in.

Variety plot exhibitors - please prepare a **10 minute talk** as introduction to the advantages of your varieties and ensure you keep to this time limit.

Agronomy plot exhibitors – please prepare a **five minute talk** as introduction to the advantages of your treatments and ensure you keep to this time limit.









Visitors are free to return to plots for further discussions throughout the day, so please make sure that your staff are available and easily recognisable (name badges or identifiable clothing please). Plots must be manned until 4.30pm.

Banners

Banners may be erected free of charge within a booked field plot or machinery exhibit space. Additional banners can be displayed on the 1m high crowd control barriers around the site at a charge of £36 + VAT per 3m length. This space will be allocated on a strictly first come first served basis. If you haven't already requested banner space but would like to bring a banner, please advise events staff on the day and we will invoice you after the event.

Feather flags or similar are permitted on site – again, free of charge if located on your booked field plot or machinery exhibit space. If you bring feather flags with you on the day and want to locate them around the site, you will be charged £20 + vat per flag or, if all located within a 3m area, a flat charge of £50 + VAT will be levied.




