
Visitor information: Craigiebuckler campus

Taxi

If you're arriving by train, you'll find a taxi rank conveniently located at the station.



Car

Heading west along Countesswells Road out of Aberdeen city, drive past Macaulay Drive (on your right) and continue for approximately 350 metres. Turn right into the walled driveway and you will see the Hutton ahead of you. Please follow signs on campus which will direct you to parking areas. Accessible parking can be found directly outside Reception in the Hutton Hub. The Institute has two-fast charge-points for electric vehicles. These are on the ChargeYourCar/ChargePlaceScotland network. To find them, enter Macaulay Drive from Countesswells Road, and take the fifth right off Macaulay Drive. The charge points are approximately 100m from the junction, on the right-hand side, opposite the greenhouse.



Train or coach

There are regular trains to Aberdeen from Dundee (1h15min), Inverness (2h15min), Edinburgh (2h30min), Glasgow Queen Street (2h45min), London Kings Cross (7h15min), London Euston (overnight) and other UK cities. See National Rail Enquiries.

Coach journeys, see National Express or Megabus.

The Aberdeen train and bus/coach stations are located at Union Square, an hours' walk, 20min cycle and 15min taxi journey from the Hutton. <u>Bike&Go</u> is available at the station.



Local bus

The Aberdeen campus is served by the number 15 (Airyhall) bus route from Union Street, stopping at Seafield Shops, a 10min walk to the Institute following Countesswells Rd and Macaulay Dr. Bus number 11a stops closest to the Hutton on Craigiebuckler Avenue (stop: Craigiebuckler Place). Bus 6, 5 and 218 stop at Kingswells Park & Ride. The number 19 bus route (Culter) and the 201/202 (Banchory) stop at Mannofield Church, a 19min walk. First Group buses (15, 11, 19) leave from Union Street. Stagecoach buses (201/202) leave from Aberdeen bus/coach station, located at Union Square. First Bus Aberdeen Stagecoach Bus



By foot

If arriving on foot, please enter via our Arboretum. As you approach on Macaulay Drive from the South, walk past the main driveway and follow the sign 50m further for a safer and more pleasant entry into our beautiful grounds. The reception is round the building, to your left. There are accessible paths leading to reception.



Cycling

The standard cycling route to the Hutton from the town centre is: Union Street - Union Grove - Cromwell Rd - Seafield Rd - Countesswells Rd - Macaulay Dr. This takes about 20mins. The route is on-road, shared with other traffic. To find our cycle shelters, cycle past the two pedestrian entrances and turn left into the back entrance. From the cycle shelters, walk around the building, keeping it on your right, to reach the reception.



Air travel

For international travellers, <u>Aberdeen Airport</u> is served from many domestic and international destinations. For international travellers, we encourage you to consider only taking one flight and then taking the bus or train within the UK.
